FIRST YEAR	
<p><i>Semester I:</i> Chemistry 103 or 109 Math (according to placement) Social Science* Foreign Language or Humanities*</p>	<p><i>Semester II:</i> Chemistry 104, if took 103; or 327 or 329, if took 109 Social Science (Psychology recommended) Foreign Language or Humanities</p>
SECOND YEAR	
<p><i>Semester I:</i> Chemistry 343 Biology 151 or Biocore 301 and 302 or Zoology 101 and 102 Additional Math, if necessary (calculus and/or stats preferred) Drawing or 3-dim. Design (at any time before applying) General Breadth/Major Requirement(s)</p>	<p><i>Semester II:</i> Chemistry 344 and/or 345 Biology 152 or Biocore 303 and 304 or upper-level Biology Additional Math, if necessary General Breadth/Major Requirement(s) (Think about dental school recommendations and from whom they will come.)</p>
THIRD YEAR	
<p><i>Semester I:</i> Organic Chemistry, if not already completed Physics 103 or 207 or 201 Intermediate/Advanced Biology (with lab) or Biocore 323 and 324 Major/Breadth Requirements (Declare major, if not already done.) (Begin to solicit dental school recommendations.)</p>	<p><i>Semester II:</i> Physics 104 or 208 or 202 Intermediate/Advanced Biology or Biocore 333 Major/Breadth Requirements Prepare and register for the DAT.† (AADSAS materials are on-line at: http://www.aadsas.adea.org)</p>
FOURTH YEAR	
<p><i>Semester I:</i> Finish application process to dental school. Take additional courses for major or general BA/BS degree. Take additional sciences which may be helpful. (Your basic pre-dental courses should be <u>completed</u> by this time.)</p>	<p><i>Semester II:</i> Complete your undergraduate degree program. Attend dental school interviews, if not already attended earlier (by invitation). Receive your <u>acceptances</u> (hopefully) from dental schools. Make decisions regarding selection of schools.</p>

*These are **examples** of general/breadth requirements, and need not be taken in this order.

† The DAT, which is computerized, may be taken throughout the year.
